The Leroy Township Trustees met in regular session on Monday, October 7, 2024, at 6 p.m., at the Leroy Township Hall.

Present were: Rich VanPelt Chairman Trustee, Heather Shelton, and Jason Rodgers, Trustees. Alexandra Brown Fiscal Officer, and Attorney at Law, Ron Graham.

Rich opened the meeting with the pledge to the flag.

Rich made a motion to approve meeting minutes from 6/10/24, 7/8/24, 8/12/024, 9/9/24, 9/20/24 with corrections. Heather 2nd. All were in favor.

Correspondence:

Lexi Brown said that she had gotten an email from NFP which is the company who manages our healthcare from Lake County. Starting January 1, 2025, any fulltime employees of the township will be able to opt into getting Aflac Accident and Critical Illness and Nationwide Pet Insurance, which is paid 100% by the employee. This does not cost Leroy Twp anything and it is available to any fulltime employee whether they take health insurance through us or not. If the township chooses to offer this to our employees more information and exact pricing will come soon in another email.

Rich made a motion to offer our employees NFP Aflac Accident and Critical Illness and Nationwide Pet Insurance which is 100% paid by the employee. Jason 2nd. All in favor.

Jason got a call from someone on Callow asking for kids at play signs to be placed on the street. While that exact sign cannot be placed on the street per ODOT regulations, there is a new regulation sign that they will place on the street.

Lori Watson – the Leroy stone from the Leroy School building will be taken over to Josh Kreiger so that he can make a bracket for it.

OLD BUSINESS:

We are currently looking for a replacement for our generator. We have two quotes for an automatic standby and are looking to split it with the township. We would be able to get a generator that would be able to power the station and the community center and fiscal office. During the recent storm we missed a call fortunately it was just a tree down on some wires but it could have been worse. Without having an automatic standby generator and the elimination of copper phone lines we have no true back up with the power. When the power goes out in the middle of the night our staff usually is not aware and this eliminates anyway of Central Communications of getting a hold of us. Thankfully this was not a major medical or structure fire call where minutes and seconds matter. This is now a major safety concern.

Just a reminder that we have our 4.5 Mil levy on the ballot this November. This is a very import part of our operational funding. Without this levy the fire department would not be able to operate. **THIS WILL NOT INCRREASE TAXES** and as always, we appreciate everyone's support.

Our new fire engine has been delivered. We are currently working with Sutphen to fix some issues. We are also evaluating what equipment and mounts we need to order to place the engine in service. We will hopefully have it in service soon.

We will be working on ordering new turnout gear for some members. We will be doing gear sizing this Friday for 6 members. The estimated cost will be \$25,200.00.

2418 will need the motor rebuilt in the near future. I will be looking into solutions for this. Right now, we are looking at \$24,000 to have it rebuilt. The truck is also still at countryside having some extensive repairs completed.

Looking at the budget closer and in discussion with potential projects that will be coming up for the general fund we will now be splitting the generator costs 80/20 percent. 80% out of fire and 20% out of general fund. Jason made a motion to place an ad for a full timer at \$20 per hr. with paying for them to get a CDL and stay with us 3yrs. Rich 2nd. All in favor.
